HOME/SCHOOL AGREEMENT POLICY

Introduction

For the children of the Trust to have the best start in life we are committed to a close partnership between the Academies and families.

To show your commitment to our values, we have this home/school agreement.

The Academies will:

Provide a safe, secure and caring environment.

Enable children of all abilities to reach their full potential whilst providing a broad and balanced curriculum.

Offer opportunities for parents/carers to become involved in the daily life of the Academies.

Reward, praise and celebrate individual, group and Academy achievement.

Encourage each child to treat others and the Academy environment with respect.

Inform parents/carers of any concerns, serious incidents, accidents or illness which occur during the child's time in school.

Inform parents/carers of the child's progress on both formal and informal occasions. Offer support systems to children/families in need.

Listen to the views of parents/carers/pupils with respect.

Parents/Carers will:

Ensure the child is punctual and attends school regularly.

Inform the school of reasons for absence either by phone or letter at the earliest opportunity.

Ensure the child is appropriately dressed and has the correct equipment for lessons, reading books etc.

Make the Academies aware of any concerns or difficulties which may affect the child's progress or behaviour.

Parents/Carers will make every effort to:

Support the Trust's policies and guidelines for behaviour, discipline and dress code. Attend parent evenings to discuss the child's progress.

Encourage and support the child in their learning, both with school and homework activities.

Approach and share views, opinions or concern with staff in an atmosphere of mutual respect.

The Child will:

Work hard and participate in all the experiences and opportunities on offer. Be polite and sociable to classmates, staff and visitors.

Listen to and be tolerant of the views and actions of others. "Think before you act".

Listen to and follow the teachers/helpers instructions.

Bring the equipment you need, care for Academy equipment, the property of other pupils and the Academy Environment.

Approach staff or parents with any personal problems or concerns so that these can be resolved.

Enjoy school and aim to be the best that you can be.
