CLASS NEWS

In Reception children follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework (EYFS). At Monkwood, we use the EYFS to develop an exciting curriculum which enables children to develop a love of learning and encourages them to become curious about the world around them.

Phonics

The children have made excellent progress in phonics so far this year! Please encourage your child to participate in the online lessons that can be accessed via the links posted on Dojo each week. Engaging in these online lessons will help to consolidate learning and enable your child to make rapid progress with early reading.

English

This half term, our topic is 'Can you Take Care of Me?' and we will be learning all about people who help us. In class, we will be reading many interesting non-fiction texts about different services such as; police, firefighters, veterinary care and health care. We also hope to received visits from people who work in these professions! Next week, we are very excited to be receiving a visit from a lady who works with guide dogs.

Mathematics

In maths, this half term, we will be learning to use the language 'more than', 'fewer than' and 'equal to' to compare sets of objects. They will also learn about the composition of numbers 3, 4 and 5. We will continue to practise counting objects within 20 and verbally count beyond 20.

Wider Curriculum

Our topics provides lots of opportunity for us to explore our school woodland area and develop a greater sense of the environment around us. The children will also learn how to respect and care for our environment.

In our Music lessons, the children will be learning to sing a variety of songs and working really hard to put on an exciting Christmas performance for you all!

In our PSHE sessions, the children will learn how we are all different but similar in some ways. We will be celebrating our differences and recognising how we are all unique! We will be encouraging the children to identify their own strengths and things that they want to improve.

In our PE sessions, the children will be learning to move in different ways through the medium of dance.
