FS1 Phonics Overview

In FS1 (Foundation Stage 1), phonics is an essential part of the early literacy curriculum, as it helps young children develop the foundational skills needed for reading and writing. At this stage, phonics is all about introducing children to the sounds that letters and groups of letters make, and helping them understand how these sounds work together to form words.

Here's a breakdown of what FS1 phonics typically involves:

Listening to Sounds

Before children start to match sounds to letters, they first need to tune in to the different sounds around them. In FS1, children practice:

- Listening to environmental sounds: This includes sounds from the world around them, such as birds, vehicles, animals, or sounds in the classroom.
- Rhyming games and songs: Rhymes help children begin to recognize patterns in sounds, which is a key precursor to phonics learning.
