CLASS NEWS

In Reception children follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework (EYFS). At Monkwood, we use the EYFS to develop an exciting curriculum which enables children to develop a love of learning and encourages them to become curious about the world around them.

Phonics

We are over the moon with the progress that the children have made so far this year! Now that the children know many single letter friends and some diagraphs ('special friends') we are focusing on blending to read words.

Please support your child's development by encouraging them to engage in the online RWI lessons at home and reading at home as frequently as possible.

Your child will receive a Dojo for every time they read at home so please don't forget to write in their reading diary!

English

This half term, our topic is 'Will you read me a story?'

During this topic we will be learning about the following traditional tales; Little Red Riding Hood, Hansel and Gretel, The Elves and the Shoemaker, Rapunzel and The Ugly Duckling. These stories provide opportunities to create lots of descriptive writing and so the children will be learning to use adjectives to describe characters and story settings. Please support your child's development by using adjectives to describe objects in your home and to describe members of your family.

Mathematics

In maths, this half term, the children will be continuing to develop their subitising skills. They will also be continuing to learn to count forwards and backwards to and from 0 and 20. The children will focus on the composition of the numbers 5, 6 and 7. They will learn to compare sets and use language of comparison.

Please support your child's development at home by encouraging them to access Numbots. Playing games like dominos and snakes and ladders will also support their mathematical development.

Wider Curriculum

In our PSHE sessions, we will be learning about the importance of persevering to enable us to tackle challenges. We will be talking about our dreams and setting achievable goals for ourselves. We will learn about the steps we need to take to achieve our goals and celebrate the achievements of others! We would love to see photos of children achieving their goals outside of school.

In our PE sessions, our theme will be gymnastics and we will be learning to travel in different ways and control our bodies when moving. We will practise moving using different speeds and we will also practise balancing on beams.

HOME LEARNING

Regular reading at home is really important and will help your child become a confident and fluent reader. Children need to read home at least three times a week, but every day is better! Please write down in their reading diary when they have read so we can award dojos for each time they have read at home.
